WHERE DOES THE MONEY GO? – OUR DATA

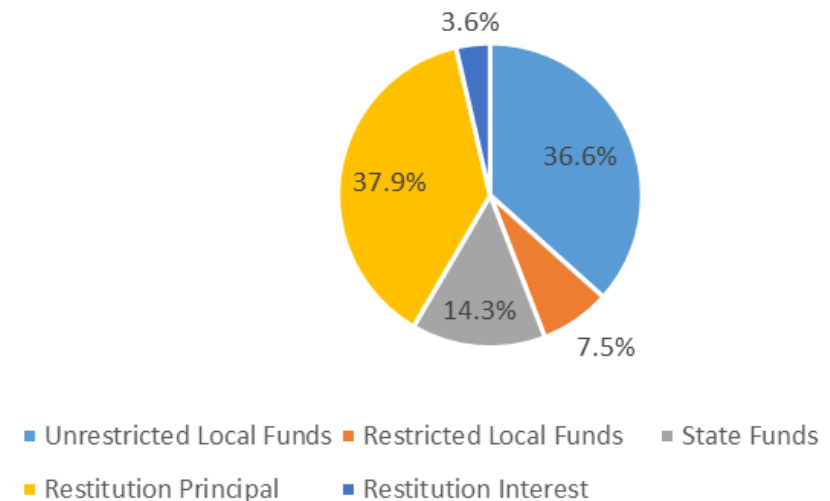


- LFOs imposed in 2014-2016; Adult SC; CLJ; Juvenile Offender
- Funds collected on those cases with LFOs imposed in 2014-2016
- Sum of Adjustments is on those cases with LFOs imposed in 2014-2016
- Excludes SCs as they transitioned to Odyssey
- Excludes Seattle Municipal Court
- Did not request case, individual or demographic markers

WHERE DOES THE MONEY GO? – THE RESULTS

- Superior Court Adult LFOs
 - Total collected \$7,702,021
 - \$2,822,636 (36.6%) in unrestricted local funds
 - \$577,612 (7.5%) in local funds for crime victim advocacy
 - \$2,922,771 (37.9%) in restitution principal
 - \$278,771 (3.6%) in restitution interest
 - \$1,100,231 (14.3%) in state revenues

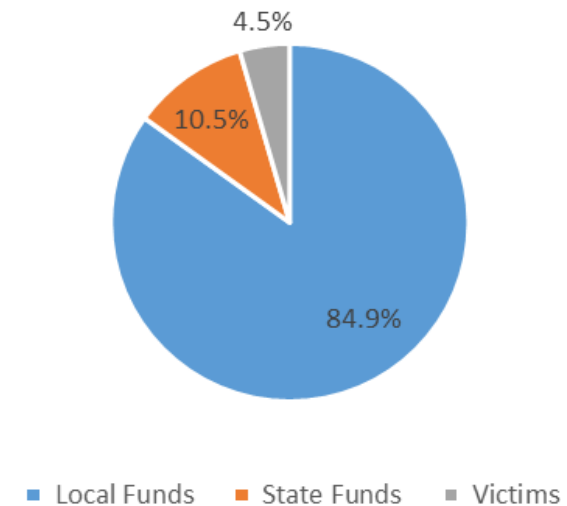
Breakdown of Funds Collected for Superior Court, Adult LFOs



WHERE DOES THE MONEY GO? – THE RESULTS (CONTINUED)

- Courts of Limited Jurisdiction LFOs
 - Total collected \$4,581,539
 - \$3,891,206 (84.9%) in local funds
 - \$207,361 (4.5%) in restitution
 - \$482,972 (10.5%) in state revenues

Breakdown of Funds Collected in Courts of Limited Jurisdiction



WHERE DOES THE MONEY GO? – THE RESULTS (CONTINUED)

- Juvenile Offender LFOs
 - Total collected \$494,123
 - \$95,130 (19.3%) in unrestricted local funds
 - \$15,850 (3.2%) in local funds for crime victim advocacy
 - \$348,209 (70.5%) in restitution principal
 - \$0 (0.0%) in restitution interest
 - \$34,935 (7.1%) in state revenues
